We pass from the summer holidays to the holidays of All Saints Day, from the Christmas holidays to the Easter holidays and, year after year, we learn to live with this alternation between work and rest.

Rest is of capital importance. In the Bible, God rests on the seventh day of the creation and invites all humanity to follow this example. Jesus himself will say to his disciples : " go aside and rest a little " (Mathew 6, 31). 
